WHO needs SafetyNet™?

PROVEN TECHNOLOGY

Radio Frequency technology can work in densely wooded areas, buildings and shallow water, even when GPS and cellular technology cannot.

TRAINED PERSONNEL

Law enforcement and other public safety agencies are trained, certified and equipped with SafetyNet Search and Rescue Receivers. In addition, personnel are trained on how to effectively communicate with people who have cognitive disorders.

COMPREHENSIVE SUPPORT SYSTEM

The SafetyNet service includes a secure database of key client information to assist in search and rescue operations as well as 24/7 customer support.

HOW does SafetyNet™ work?

- ◆ Your loved one wears a SafetyNet bracelet at all times. The bracelet features a radio frequency transmitter that emits a continuous signal.
- ◆ When you realize your loved one is missing, you contact authorities immediately.
- ◆ Trained search and rescue teams at the Lake County Sheriff's Office use SafetyNet Search and Rescue receivers to track the radio frequency signal being emitted from the SafetyNet bracelet.
- ◆ Once our deputies locate your loved one, they can be rescued and returned home safely.

It's **SIMPLE** and **CONVENIENT** to use SafetyNet's proven technology to find and rescue individuals with cognitive disorders who tend to wander and become lost.

If a loved one does go missing

A caregiver calls the Lake County Sheriff's Office and gives the client's name, assigned frequency number and other pertinent information relating to the incident. Trained Electronic Search Specialists respond to the scene. With the use of receiving devices on their vehicles, as well as hand-held receivers, deputies are able to pick up the signal from the transmitter and locate the missing person.

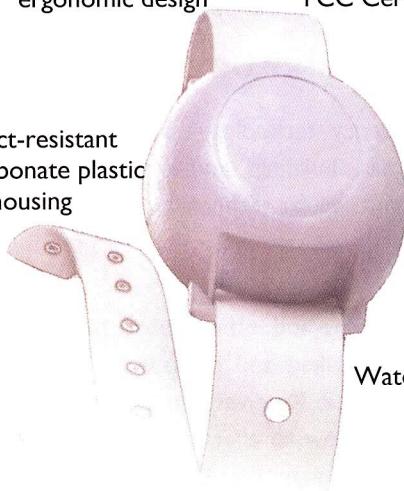
